Insiders Poultry Situation

Chicken industry observers are still undecided on the strength of boneless breast meat and tenders. What we're certain of is that both lines are rated full steady and they're trading at levels that are full market or better, but there's still something missing. The aggressive tone that so often coincides with a firm market is not present, at least not to degree that the industry expected. With that said, both lines were left unchanged this week. Wings, on the other hand, are being hotly pursued following what many are considering to be one of the greatest sporting weekends ever. Market values are full market or better for jumbo sized product specifically. Whole birds and WOGs are well supported, as is thigh meat. Whole legs, leg quarters, drumsticks and leg meat are still under varying degrees of pressure. Supplies are deemed at least adequate to fully adequate for spot needs which are no better than fair. Also worth noting is that sources are beginning to report that finding available trucks has become increasingly difficult.

Dallas-Based Wingstop Files for \$86.25M IPO

Dallas restaurant chain Wingstop on Wednesday announced it filed paperwork for an \$86.25 million stock debut under the ticker symbol WING. According to American City Business Journals, the company has not specified how many shares will be offered, but has applied to trade on the NASDAQ.

Speculation has swirled for months on a potential initial public offering. With more than 670 locations, Wingstop has more restaurants than competitor Buffalo Wild Wings did when it started trading publicly in late 2003, according to the Motley Fool.

"I want to say we're going to be the McDonald's of the wing industry, and basically, we are at this point," Wingstop Executive Chairman Jim Flynn said in 2012. "Because there's nobody else this big."

In 2014, Wingstop reported annual net income of nearly \$9 million. With that financial context, The Motley Fool estimated its IPO could raise up to \$100 million and value the chain around \$500 million.

That will help fuel Wingstop's growth strategy of 2,500 units and expand its international presence, according to paperwork filed with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.
